

Speaking up for Arts and Culture in the City of Barrie

As most who are reading this will already be aware, a few weeks back the City of Barrie announced that they would be exiting their lease with Georgian Theatre. This news triggered a tremendous response from the community, a response that has, we are pleased to report, prompted the City to give this decision further consideration.

Acknowledging that the proposed venue alternatives do not meet the needs of the users of Georgian Theatre, the City is recognizing the hard-hitting loss that the closure will cause to the performing arts in Barrie and we have you to thank for that! Through Social Media, petitions, and direct correspondence and communications with the Mayor and City Council, you are making your voices heard and we are ever so grateful but, we are not there yet!!

Citing the need for repairs to the facility to continue operations, the City is acting on a recommendation to pursue a grant through the Canada Healthy Communities program to cover the expense. Representatives from various arts

While the list of repairs is seemingly long and costly, the community representatives are focused on paring it down to include only those that would be necessary to maintain safe operations when the time comes to reopen. This will be imperative to ensure that the continued use of Georgian Theatre remains an interim measure until Barrie can cut the ribbon on a new and long-overdo performing arts venue.

Regardless, the grant results will be the determining factor in both what gets done and when so nothing is final, but this development does, at least, represent a willingness on the part of the City to review the matter in more detail. What's important now is to not let our Mayor, Councillors, and the City Staff designated to cultural development forget why Barrie needs a theatrical venue that better serves the needs of this City's various performing arts organizations.

To help ensure that the needs of our community remain forefront, representatives from 16 different arts and culture organizations have formed an action committee to carry our message forward. And now, it would seem, the City has identified the value of establishing a Performing Arts Centre Task Force to, hopefully, help move things along. This development was revealed on review of the Agenda for next Monday's General Committee meeting and we look forward to a positive result.

We are encouraged by these developments but must stress that this is all happening because of you. The voice of the community is a powerful thing and we must keep it up!!


It's a Wrap - Directing Webinar Series
